Distribution: starting day before Trout Season when traffic is heavy through New Bethlehem and then throughout the remainder of the year. Volunteers will pass out 1000 or more brochures to travelers passing through New Bethlehem on SR 28. Then the brochures will be distributed throughout the area at local restaurants, stores, businesses, at events, in the trail kiosks along the 42-mile Redbank Valley Trail from Brookville to the Allegheny River, and on the websites of local organizations.

Cost: \$45 which covers the cost of design work and printing. We are trying to print more brochures this year for wider distribution. In the past, we have been able to obtain some grant funding to assist in the cost, but that was not available for this year.
