REDBANK CREEK

A true hidden gem of Western Pennsylvania, the Redbank Creek affords recreationalists kayaking and fishing opportunities. Creek access points are located near the Moore Rd. and Hawthorn Trailheads, just below the New Bethlehem Dam and at 4365 Climax Rd. Climax, PA.

If you prefer to stay dry, then spend time painting, photographing or watching birds along the shores of the creek.

MAHONING DAM

The Mahoning Dam is a concrete gravity dam that holds back the waters of the Mahoning Creek Lake. Built in 1941, it boasts the best dam tour next to Hoover Dam. Call 814-257-8811 at least 2 weeks in advance to arrange for private tours for groups of 10 or more.






